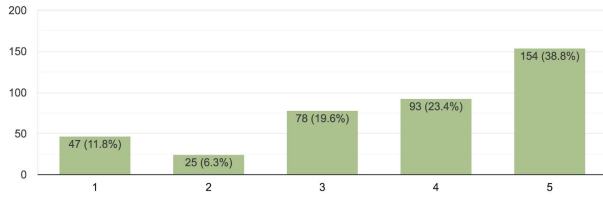

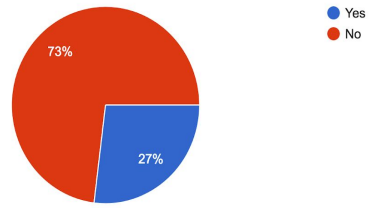
1. I am familiar with the BE A SHARK campaign and its intended goals and purpose.

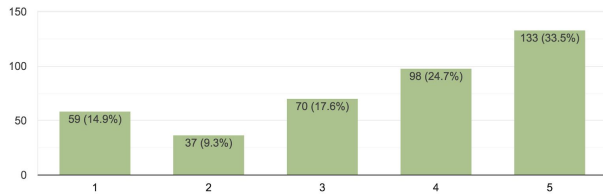
2. Can you name all 5 BE A SHARK values (S.H.A.R.K.)?

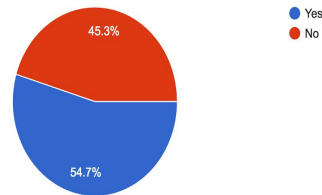
3. I am familiar with the Shark Bytes reward system and how it is used to reinforce positive student behaviors.

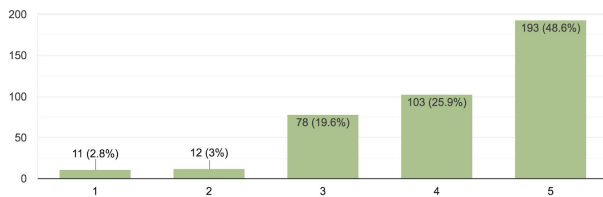
4. Have you ever discussed BE A SHARK topics (behaviors, rewards, or classroom lessons) with your student?

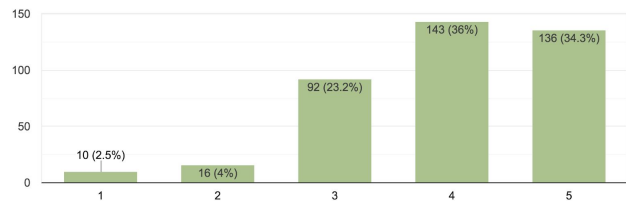
7. What is Santiago's responsibility for teaching positive behavior to your student(s)?

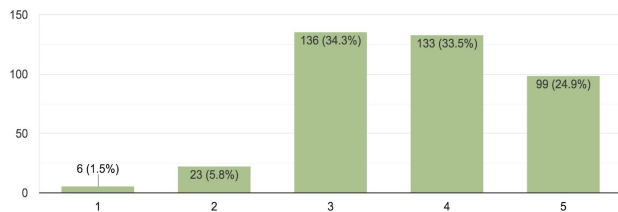
8. How well does Santiago teach, model, and reinforce positive student behavior?

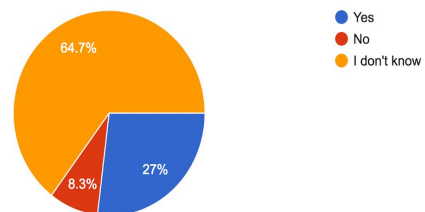
9. When I encounter Santiago students in the community, I am impressed with their conduct and behavior.

Free responses (highlights):

- The rewards program needs an overhaul. My kids think it's lame and never cash in for prizes.
- Your teachers should model the same behavior.

- I feel that Santiago Students are so different from other schools, they have integrity, respect and a value to do great things in the community
- Students know that attention is paid and priority given to their personal conduct. Consequences and rewards are both available. That raises the bar and challenges them to do better.
- My daughter has told me she sees kids actually acting out the method and she sees more positive than negative student interaction then at past schools.
- The students are more aware of the expectations by the school
- The students feel part of something much bigger and want to represent their school with pride
- My kid had more school spirit this year she participates in more activities and dress up days
- Students starting to be more respectful and responsible in the community
- If anything, it sets an expectation that is achievable, desirable and respectable
